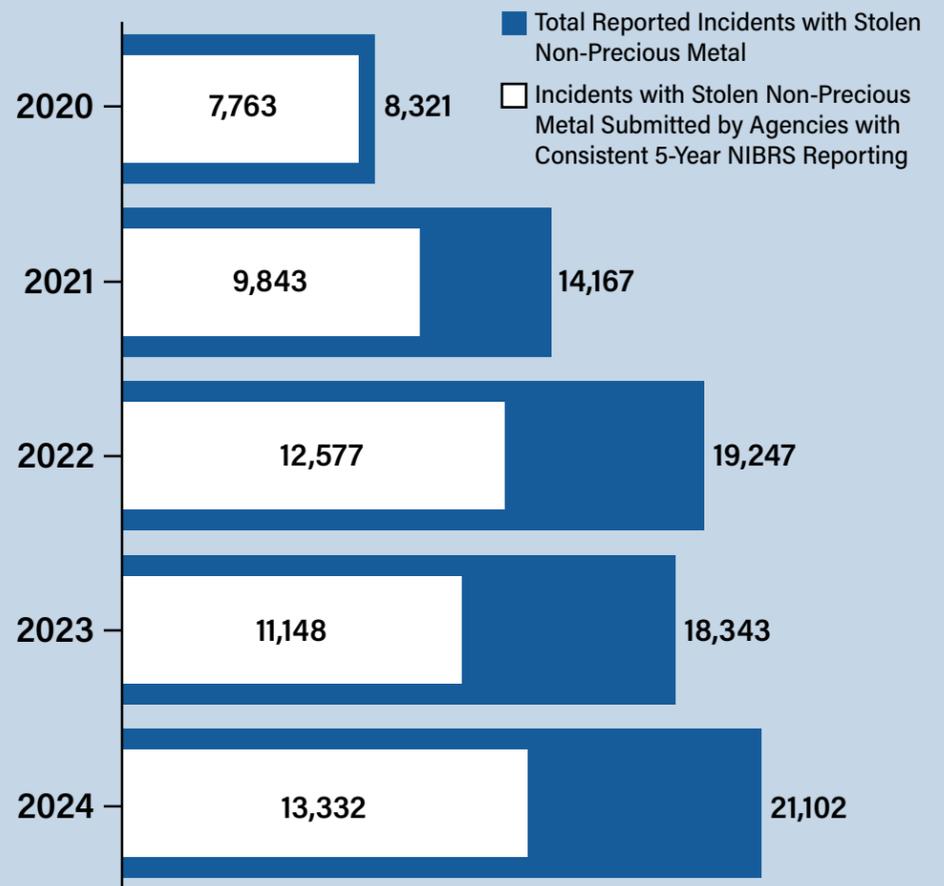


## Incidents

The FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program considers non-precious metals to include ferrous and non-ferrous metals such as iron, steel, tin, aluminum, copper, brass, copper wire, copper pipe, etc.

From 2020 through 2024, 6,522 agencies reported 81,180 incidents involving stolen non-precious metal via the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

To account for increases in NIBRS participation, this figure includes a year-to-year comparison in which only incidents reported by agencies consistently submitting NIBRS data throughout the entire 5-year span of 2020 through 2024 are displayed. With the exception of this depiction with year-to-year reported incident volumes, all other data shown on this page refer to the total dataset of 81,180 incidents.

### Most Frequently Reported Offense Types per Incident

Destruction/Damage/Vandalism	11,552	14.2



### Most Frequently Reported Location Types per Incident

Residence/Home	20,232	24.9
Commercial/Office Building	10,716	13.2
Construction Site	9,488	11.7

\*63.1% of burglaries in which non-precious metal was stolen involved forcible entry



## Property Details



Tools were also stolen in 10.7% of incidents.

Drugs were seized in 559 incidents.

Amphetamines/methamphetamines were reported in 63.5% of incidents involving seized drugs.



## Arrests

- 10,431 arrests were made in connection with 7,864 incidents.
- 32.7% of persons arrested in connection with stolen non-precious metal incidents were between 30-39 years old.
- 48.9% of arrests occurred on the **same day** as the incident.

45.4% arrested for All Other Larceny

26.0% arrested for Burglary/B&E

8.3% arrested for Shoplifting
